## **Majestic Mountain Ministries Cabin Use Procedures**

**Please read the following pages carefully. We hope that you will enjoy your visit to God's majestic mountains and find the time to slow down, relax, and reflect on God's goodness to you. As with your house, we also have some house rules. We hope that you will show respect for the property and help us take care of it so others might enjoy it as you do. We are here to serve you, and if you have any further questions, please feel free to contact our office.**

**Due to remote location of the cabins and lack of full time staff, MMM does not provide maid service. Therefore, we need your help by each guest being responsible for leaving the cabin as clean as they found it. (All cleaning supplies provided in each cabin.) Please do not attempt any cabin maintenance such as clogged toilets, clogged sinks, broken bulbs, etc. Please do leave us a list of any item in need of repair or replacement before you leave. Each cabin will have a checklist of things to do to prepare the cabin for our next honored guest, so please complete the checklist for us so we will know everything is ready. Should you need assistance for repairs, please contact our property manager for major problems at: 719-486-2208 or night at cell # 512-751-1965.**

**\*To help keep the floors clean and protect the carpet, we ask that you please remove your shoes before you enter the cabin, and leave them either on the porch or just inside door on the rug under the bench provided. Even during the dryer season, gravel and dirt will wear on the flooring if tracked in from outdoors. This will also expedite your cleaning of the cabin before you leave.**

- Extra Clean sheets are in each bedroom closet. Please leave dirty sheets in the tub in the bathroom.**

- **Bathroom towels, wash cloths, etc. are provided. Please leave wet dirty towels IN the bathtub. Please do not flush anything besides toilet paper we provide down the toilets. We are on a septic system, so no feminine products, tissue, or paper towels in the commodes will clog the pipes.**
- **Our water supply is limited to one well which is certified for drinking water and all other uses you may prefer. Please help us by not wasting our water by conserving your usage.**
- **Trash bags are furnished...but please do not set trash outside. We have wildlife (bears) that love to go through the trash! Please just tie up bag and leave in cabin or take to our metal dumpster. Please be sure to close the lid properly.**
- **The kitchen in each cabin is fully furnished with plates, glasses, utensils, etc...for snacks or light meals. Please wash your dishes. No stove is available and we don't want you cooking a full meal in the cabin. A microwave and small refrigerator is provided for Snack Foods, sandwiches, popcorn, pre-packaged meals, etc. Restaurants are close by in Leadville (20 minutes), Granite (10 minutes) and Buena Vista (25-30 minutes). A coffee maker and toaster are also provided for your convenience.**
- **Please turn off lights and fireplace when not in use or every time you leave the cabin. (Gas fireplace thermostat is on the wall make sure lever is turned all the way down) Outside lights should be left on at all times. The central heat for each cabin is fueled by propane and is controlled by a thermostat just like in your home.**
- **Smoking is never allowed in any of the buildings. There will be NO exceptions. Any use of fire outdoors MUST be done ONLY with staff assistance. NO exceptions. We must all do everything to help prevent Forest Fires since we are in a remote area!!!**
- **No Alcoholic beverages are allowed on the property.**
- **No pets are allowed in the cabins or the conference center.**

- **Speaking of pets...Please Do Not Feed or approach the wildlife. You are in the wilderness, and we do have animals that come on the property...including bears. It is important not to leave food or trash outside. Please keep your cabin door closed at all times.**
- **A telephone is provided in the cabins...mainly for emergency use. This is the same line as the James' main house. (719-486-2208)  
(There is no internet access)**
- **Cell phone use is very limited in and around the mountains. Remember this is your retreat away from it all....so limited communication isn't a bad thing!**
- **Due to high altitude, rough terrain, and wilderness wildlife and setting, we strongly discourage bringing children under the age of 6 years old.**
- **Please do not leave children under 18 years old unattended in the cabins.**
- **Brochures are in each cabin informing you on area attractions and places of interest. If you want specific information, please ask and we will try to provide it to you. If you want to schedule certain activities during your visit, such as fishing, hiking, skiing, snow-mobiling, shopping, and the like, let us know and we will assist you.**


## **Tips on Making Your Mountain Trip Safer and More Enjoyable**

- **During, and three or four days prior to your trip, start drinking plenty of water! You need lots of water to prepare your body for the altitude and dry air conditions. Our property is at 9,600 feet above sea level.**
- **At least three days prior, begin taking one baby aspirin and two TUMS (must be TUMs) at mealtime twice a day and continue to do so for the first three days during your visit. The aspirin is good for your heart any way, but it will also begin to thin your blood so it can carry more oxygen at the higher altitude. The TUMs help reduce the gases in your body so you don't feel as "full" at altitude. Doing this reduces the possibility of being affected by altitude sickness. Drinking lots of water is also the key to feeling better. These are actions which may improve your health where you live also if you can get into the habit.**
- **The first day or so of your visit, you will need to get acclimated to the high altitude. Taking the recommended actions above will greatly help you. Still, take it easy until you can tell how you are feeling. Should you experience sleepiness, headaches, gassy stomachs, or stuffing feeling,**

**treat yourself as you would at home by taking a nap, take your preference headache or stomach medicine. Different people react differently at altitude. Some are not affected or only slightly, others have multiple affects in varying degrees. You must eat even when you don't feel like it and continue to drink water because it will help bring relief. Altitude affects usually only last a couple of days, but if you are not feeling better, let us know to see if we can help! It is not uncommon to experience shortness of breath until your body adjusts, so take it easy and don't over do it until you feel better. Just enjoy the peace and quiet. Forget the clock and rest and relax. Enjoy God's creation.**

- If you wish to hike around the property...let someone know. Leave a note in the cabin. If you stop your car to explore, leave a note in your car.**
- Colorado weather varies and changes quickly! Summer has warmer days...but can also snow and gets quite cold during evening hours. Thunderstorms can form quickly. Be prepared with Jackets, rain gear, food snacks, plenty of water, etc...Never leave the cabin and hike unprepared!**
- We mentioned wildlife and bears. Do not feed the animals! Even at the zoo, caged animals have killed! Chipmunks are prevalent...deer, elk, bears, beavers, wild cats, and at night, coyotes! Have your camera ready...except for the coyotes!**
- In the warmer months, you might want to fish at the Twin lakes or at near by Four Bay Lake. ( License required)**

## Directions

From Denver:

- From Denver International Airport: Take Pena Blvd. south to I-70
- Take Interstate 70 West into Denver and then out of the Denver area
- You will travel around 70 miles passing towns like Georgetown, then Dillon, then Silverthorne and Frisco
- You will take exit 195 Hwy 91 to Copper Mountain Ski Resort and Leadville. This highway travels South only. You will travel over Freemont Pass (11,318 Feet) and continue into Leadville
- Follow the main road through Leadville (Hwy 24) (Hwy 91 ends in Leadville) and continue South to Hwy 82, about 12 miles South of Leadville.
- Turn right on Hwy 82 (West)
- Drive approx. 3 miles and turn right on Lake County Road 24 (There is a right turn lane) If you get to the general store in the town of Twin Lakes you have gone too far.
- Continue on Lake County Road 24 and stay on the paved portion. You will pass a large lake on your left
- After passing the lake, the road will turn from paved to dirt. Turn left where you see the Majestic Mountain Ministries sign

From Colorado Springs Municipal Airport:

- Exit airport and turn Right on S. Powers Blvd.
- Turn Left on E. Fountain Blvd. This becomes US 24
- Merge onto I-25 North
- Take exit 141 - US 24 W. Cimarron Street
- Travel Approximately 90 miles on US 24 to Johnson Village
- Turn right at T-intersection in Johnson Village to continue North on US 24 to Buena Vista
- Continue on Hwy 24 North past Granite to Hwy 82. Turn left on Hwy 82 to Twin Lakes
- Drive approx. 3 miles and turn right on Lake County Road 24 (There is a right turn lane) If you get to the general store in the town of Twin Lakes you have gone too far
- Continue on Lake County Road 24 and stay on the paved portion. You will pass a large lake on your left
- After passing the lake, the road will turn from paved to dirt. Turn left where you see the Majestic Mountain Ministries sign
